## Teacher Supply and Demand

- In the last five years, demand for Educational Service workers in Texas grew at a modest pace, according to the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages.
- In the first quarter of 2018, the number of workers in Educational Services in Texas was 1.22 million, up 8.9 percent from the same quarter in 2013.
- The Educational Services industry in Texas is facing growing demand from a marketplace that increasingly needs better educated workers for a more "knowledge-based economy" as well as an expanding population bringing more students into schools.

## **UTRGV Teacher Education Program**

- Approximately 550 admitted candidates per academic year
- 87% acceptance rate
- Elementary (Bilingual, Special Education, ESL, Early Childhood) and All Level / Secondary (Music, Kinesiology, Mathematics, English Language Arts, Social Studies, Science, etc.)
- In 2018-2019, 598 candidates finished the program.
- 88% of completers passing PPR certification exam.
- 82% of completers passed their CONTENT certification exam.
- 91.22% remaining in the profession for 5 years.

- 1. Go to the TEA website, tea.texas.gov, and click ECOS for Educators at the top of the main page.
- 2. On the next screen, click Create a new TEAL account.
- Enter required information on the TEAL user information page. You must enter the name in TEAL as it exists on your Texas
  Driver's License/State ID card and on your Educator Certification. Do not use nicknames (example: "Bill" vs. "William") or
  other variations.

If your name has changed or differs between these sources, STOP, and follow the <u>Name Change instructions</u> on our website before completing your TEAL profile.


Also, capitalize the first letter of your first and last name and make the rest lower case. For example: Jane Doe; Not JANE DOE or jane doe.

4. Select "Educator" for the Organization Type, enter the required information, and click Submit.





## **TEXES Exams Required for Certification**

## Bilingual Generalist, Early Childhood, ESL/Generalist, and Special Education Certifications

- Core Subjects & Science of Teaching Reading
- Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities EC-12 (160)

Bilingual, Special Education, and ESL Supplemental exams will be approved by department's Program Coordinator.

## Middle School, High School, and All Level Certifications (EDUC)

- Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities EC-12 (160)
- Content Exam

Content exams must be approved by departmental representative.

**Uteach** candidates will need to get approval from their Uteach Master Teacher for both PPR and Content.





## **Elementary TExES Protocol and Policy**

Admission to Elementary Teacher Education Program



#### Semester 1

- Complete Core
   Subjects Certify
   Teacher with an
   80% passing score
   in each section to
   receive approval
   to take actual
   TEXES exam
- Take TEXES Core Subjects exam



## End of Semester 2

- Eligible to take TEXES PPR exam after completing 12 hours of EDCI (pedagogy) coursework
- Complete PPR Certify Teacher with an 80% passing score to take actual TEXES exam





## Middle School, High School, and All Level TEXES Protocol and Policy

- Approval for PPR EC-12 TExES exam
  - PPR Certify Teacher program requirement completed (80% Passing Score)
  - Must take and pass EDUC 3302 with a "C" or better
- Approval for Content TExES exam
  - Content Certify Teacher program requirement completed (80% Passing Score)
  - Eligibility Form signed by Program Coordinator

## **UTeach TExES Protocol and Policy**

- Approval for PPR EC-12 and Content TExES exam
  - Eligibility Form signed by Master Teacher and UTeach Co-Director





### Retesting & HB 2205

- You will be approved to take exam once; re-approval will be required to retest. Please visit our website, <u>www.utrgv.edu/cep</u> to request a TExES retest.
- A test can be retaken after 45 days.
- Pearson registration system will only display test dates that are at least 45 days after the previous test date

#### <u>(HB 2205)</u>

- Beginning September 1, 2015 candidates will be limited to <u>four attempts to retake</u> any educator certification examination. The Texas Education Agency (TEA) is implementing this change to Texas Education Code §21.048 in response to HB 2205, 84th Texas Legislature, 2015.
- A list of FAQ will be uploaded to Blackboard along with this PowerPoint presentation.

#### Retaking Core Subjects EC-6

- You must take all of the sections of the Core Subjects exam the first time.
- It is recommended that if you are retaking 2 or more sections of the Core Subjects EC-6 that you register for the full exam and skip the sections that you have passed.
- Each attempt at a single subject exam counts towards HB2205.
