

# Faculty Innovation, Development, and Enhancement (FIDE): A Program for Mid-Career Faculty 2024-2025

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Faculty Innovation, Development, and Enhancement (FIDE) is a program, developed by the Office of Faculty Affairs and the Division of Research, to support <u>mid-career faculty</u>. This program is designed to assist faculty who would benefit from revision, restart, innovation, or further development of their scholarly agendas.

FIDE will hold eight three-hour trainings workshops with focus on:

- Strategically thinking about and pursuit of new scholarship agenda.
- Development of high impact scholarly/creative projects.
- Identification and successful pursuit of external funding opportunities.
- Engagement in meaningful collaborative efforts and projects.
- Align one's teaching and service with their scholarship.

In addition, FIDE will organize two 4-day "Write-Ins" that will provide participating faculty with the time and space for implementation. During these Write-Ins, faculty will have access to staff who specialize in writing and grant development.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Eligibility requirements are as follows:

- 1. Must have a UTRGV full-time, tenured Associate or Full Professor appointment.
  - a. For tenured Associate Professors: must not have completed more than 12 years at rank.
  - b. For tenured Full Professors: must not have completed more than six years at rank.
- 2. Be in good standing with the institution.

## **SELECTION PROCESS & DEADLINES**

- Department chairs/school directors nominate faculty by Monday, July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at 5:00 p.m.
- Nominations will be reviewed for eligibility by the Office of Faculty Affairs.
- Based on nominations received, the Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs and the Faculty Affairs team will craft the first cohort of FIDE by mid-August.



# PROGRAM INCENTIVE AND DELIVERABLES

Upon successful completion, participants will receive a certificate and a \$500 research incentive to be transferred into their departmental accounts. To successfully complete the program, faculty must

- Attend 6 out of 8 workshop sessions
- Attend both Write Ins
- Write and deliver a 3-to-5-year scholarship agenda *and* one of the below:
  - Draft of a scholarly product.
  - Draft grant proposal.
