

## **To Valley Stay Characteristics**


- Stayed in the Valley 4.2 months

### Winter Texan Computer Usage


- 70.9 percent subscribe to an Internet service in their home state

- 66 percent consider information as important or very important in Internet use and gratification


#### Winter Texan Health
