ABUSE AND NEGLECT

Abuse and Neglect

- Sexual
- Physical
- Mental
- Emotional

Abuse is Mental, emotional, physical, or sexual injury to a child or failure to prevent such injury.

Neglect is Failure to provide a child with food, clothing, shelter and /or medical care Leaving a child in a situation that places them at risk of harm.

- Report to Youth Program Support Manager
- Report to parent, if not implicated
- If of a sexual nature, call Title IX office at 956-665-2103 even if this happened off campus
- If abuse occurred on campus, call UTRGV Police Department 956-665-7157 or 956-882-7777(UTRGV)
- If alleged abuser is a staff member, contact HR for appropriate guidance
- Submit Maxient Incident Report on Youth Programs website on date of occurrence

BEHAVIORAL

- Fighting
- Bullying
- Tobacco products
- Vaping devices
- Property damage
- Theft
- Illegal drugs & alcohol

- Notify parent immediately
- Contact UTRGV Police Department
- Submit Maxient Incident Report on Youth Programs website on date of occurrence

MEDICAL

Serious injury/ illness

- Call 911 Ensure the camp medical release and medical history forms are provided to emergency personnel
- Contact UTRGV Police Department
- Notify parent immediately
- A UTRGV staff member must accompany injured minor to emergency treatment facility until parents arrive
- Submit Maxient Incident Report on Youth Programs website on date of occurrence
- Notify supervisor of serious injury on date of occurrence

Non-emergency care beyond what camp can provide

- Minor injury
- Nausea
- Cold/ Cough/Fever
- Falls
- Scratches, minor cuts, blisters, etc.

- Notify parent immediately
 - Take minor to UTRGV Student Health Services to assess and provide first aid; take Confidential Medical Information form (If injury occurs off campus, determine appropriate medical facility)
- Submit Maxient Incident Report on Youth Programs website on date of occurrence
- Provide care based on Confidential Medical Information form consent (topical ointments, bandages, etc.)
- Notify parents immediately

TRAVEL	
Incidents occurring during	 Follow aforementioned guidance based on incident
program travel	 For vehicular accidents, call 911 for assistance, for non-emergency assistance contact local PD
	 As per travel policy, UTRGV Police Department must also be notified of accidents regardless of location
	 Based on severity of accident, assess situation and provide care as possible to minor participants as assistance arrives
	 Notify parents immediately and/or as possible based on severity of accident Notify supervisor of the accident on date of occurrence Notify school districts or other involved parties
	 If any injuries, seek guidance from Environmental Health and Safety Office (956) 665-3690 (such staff injury protocol and youth program insurance) on date of occurrence
	 Submit Maxient Incident Report on Youth Programs website on date of occurrence

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
